Tuesday, April 6, 2021

Plenary I: Friday, April 9, 2021

- PROPOSED AMENDMENT #3: amend Article I, Section (m) Technology Committee, to change the committee composition from seven members, one of whom must be a member of the finance committee, to having a Chairman and representative from each region, one of whom must be a member of the Finance Committee
- PROPOSED AMENDMENT #4: amend Article1 to add Risk Management as a standing committee
- PROPOSED AMENDMENT #5: amend Article II (2), Section 20 to clarify that chapters are not freestanding and that all contracts beyond \$100,000 require the approval of the Supreme Basileus
- PROPOSED AMENDMENT #6: amend Article IV (4), Section 9 to add a subsection that an
 active soror who has been a member of the sorority for at least seventy-five (75) years
 may obtain life membership by application to the Corporate Office without payment of
 additional fees
- PROPOSED AMENDMENT #7: amend Article IV (4), Section 32, to change the name cosponsor, and indicate that one of the recommending sorors may be a soror who is not a member of the chapter where the candidate will be initiated
- PROPOSED #8: amend Article XV (15) to clarify that bylaw amendments, adopted at the Boule that impact chapters, shall be added to the chapter's bylaws without having to follow the amendment process noted in the chapter's bylaws
